NH Policing Team Update

Police station – “The Meeting Place” (located at the closed Finbows gym) is set to open on 12 November. The office occupied by the police will not be accessible to the public but, it is hoped, there will be a police presence one or two mornings per week at the café, which plans to open 9am-2pm.

Figures from 18th July to 16th October and compared to same period in 2011.

Notts crime figures have continued to decrease. Notts Police Division have now been placed into the top ten forces, in the country. A huge improvement from 42/43.

In cooperation from requests from our cluster, Derbyshire police will drive through our area, when possible, en route to Bridewell Police Station, for example. This is a reciprocal arrangement, to show a police presence, and is working well.

Action Point NHW Coordinators to remind residents to lock their doors and close curtains, when dark, to help prevent burglary when expensive TV's etc are on show.

Review of Neighbourhood Priorities

Vehicle Related Nuisance

Speed Enforcement Checks conducted in the following areas: Hickings Lane, Ilkeston Road Stapleford, Hillside Road Bramcote and Nottingham Road Stapleford.

Number of vehicles stopped: 78

Verbal warnings: 70

Number of Fixed Penalty Notices issues for speeding: 7

Report for summons: 1

Number of Section 59 Notices issued: 3

It was noted that whilst speeding is consistently a major concern of residents in the cluster, it is, in fact, local residents who are the main offenders of speeding in the area.

Fear of Crime namely Burglary

Beat team have patrolled hot spot areas

Beat Team have target hardened repeat/vulnerable victims/locations (leaflets/workshops)

Beat Team have sent out numerous Neighbourhood Alerts to promote burglary awareness

Anti Social Behaviour

Op Animism/Pub visits are still being carried out on a Tuesday and Friday evening (decline of disorder incidents in public houses)

Beat team have patrolled areas highlighted by Neighbourhood Priority Surveys. Joint work with Housing department and ASB officer at Broxtowe Borough Council are ongoing to tackle ASB issues.

- Drugs Warrant conducted at Lime GROVE, Stapleford positive result no offender(s) identified at this time as there are no full records of who had the tenancy agreement with the property.
- Drugs warrant Matthews Court male arrested ongoing enquiries
- 2 Burglary others at Shop Montrose Court 1st time 1 male arrested 2nd time 2 further males arrested.
- Repeat shop lifter from the Co Op arrested and charged to court.
- ASB issues surrounding the Youth Club at Stapleford being addressed with a joint agency approach, meeting scheduled for Thursday 18/10/2012 in relation to this.
- Offender dealt with for selling articles in breach of copyright (Information acted upon via Crimestoppers).
- Locations for ASB have been added to Op ANIMISM patrol plan.

Identification and agreement of 3 Neighbourhood Priorities

Between Sunday 1st July 2012 and Friday 30th September 2012 a total number of 79 surveys were carried out in the Stapleford Neighbourhood

Using the online survey data (this includes all surveys even those not completed online, the results of the Neighbourhood Priority Surveys which have been completed are as follows:
