NH Policing Team Update

Staffing - PC Barlow was welcomed back from his extended temporary promotion.

Police station – Existing location is still the operating base and receiving mail, for now. DP advised plans submitted this week for the old Finbows Gym to include a police station:

Toton/Chilwell Meadows police are now operating from the Toton Tesco. Beeston, being the main police station in the area, is now opening for longer. It is an operational response base working 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The Front Counter is open Monday to Friday, 8am until 10pm, and Saturday, 8am until 4pm, for help and advice and to report incidents.

Notts Police Division has dramatically improved performance from 42/43 to 7/43 in the country. Of the five garage burglaries, three had been left open/unlocked. See <https://www.nottinghamshirealert.co.uk/da/18367> regarding shed security and discounts offered from B&Q.

The 27 year old male, who assaulted an elderly lady in Bramcote village and two others in Stapleford, has been sentenced to four years in prison. The Farm Shop in Bramcote, organised a local collection and £400 was raised to help these victims. Cross-boarder controls have commenced. PC Chris Copley and his Sandiacre counterpart are patrolling together.

Review of Neighbourhood Priorities

Vehicle Related Nuisance

Speed Enforcement Checks conducted in Stapleford by Special Constables in areas including but not exclusive to Ilkeston Road Bramcote, Hickings Lane Stapleford, Hillside Road Bramcote resulting in a number of drivers being dealt with for a variety of different motoring offences not just speeding.

Section 59 Notices have been issued to several motor cyclists and one motorbike has been seized from a male that had been frequently riding it around footpaths and parks in Stapleford.

At least 7 fixed penalty notices have been issued to the owners of vehicles that have been seen to be causing unnecessary obstructions by the way they have parked on Windsor Street Stapleford, double yellow lines have now been painted on the road to prevent further issues.

If a vehicle is uninsured the police can impose a £200 penalty plus 6 points on their licence and impound the vehicle at a fee of £150 plus £12/day. The owner requires proof of insurance before the vehicle is released.

Action Point from last quarter – CA contacted Road Safety Dept. – they refused to bring the speeding enforcement van to A52. Tuesdays, police specials operate the speeding gun in the area. KB will try to flag our area as an

enforcement area. This information should filter through to SATNAV's. Fear of Crime namely Burglary

Neighbourhood Policing Team (NPT) continuing to target harden and leaflet drop after a burglary, Neighbourhood Alert has been utilised to increase the amount of users to the system. This provided crime information and updates for area specific. Currently an operation running in the Chilwell area which is specifically targeting SAC (serious acquisitive crime) offences in the Chilwell area which on occasion officers from Stapleford are being used to cover, similar tactics to the ones being used in Chilwell will be adopted on a smaller scale by the local beat team from Stapleford.

Regarding <http://www.broxtowecommunity.co.uk/> SAS reviewed the schools websites. WHP federation and Foxwood Schools have a link from their website. SAS wrote to Wadsworth, Bramcote Hills and Bramcote C of E to ask if they could add the link to their links section of their website. RM advised Wadsworth promote the website on regular newsletters. SAS also to organise KB to visit St Michael's Church Toddler group, in September, to sign up parents to the scheme. CA sends relevant crime protection information with his alerts.

Anti Social Behaviour

Op Animism/Pub visits (decline of disorder incidents in public houses)
NPT have patrolled hotspot areas and no groups of youths seen. The cluster now boasts the second best pubs, according to pubwatch, in Nottinghamshire. The beat officers have built on the existing good work from the previous licensing officer.

Regarding neighbour disputes, which make up a large percentage of "other" crime reported - Alli Marshall from Broxtowe Borough Council has recently been appointed Housing Officer. She is reported to be very proactive. The Housing Department work with the police towards evicting nuisance neighbours.

Identification and agreement of 3 Neighbourhood Priorities

Between Sunday 1st April 2012 and Friday 29th June 2012 a total number of 77 surveys were carried out in the Stapleford Neighbourhood
