### NH Policing Team Update

There have been a number of moves within the Broxtowe South beat teams:

PCSO 4687 Gealy has moved from Stapleford to now cover Chilwell West working from Beeston Police station.

PC 2882 Barlow is now the beat manager for Bramcote and Beeston North however will be still based at Stapleford Police station.

PC 2631 Copley is now the beat manager for Stapleford South West and South East beats, working from Stapleford Police station.

PCSO 8916 Alistair Butterfield will be moving to Stapleford Police station from Arnold Police station in April 2013 to cover the Stapleford beat area.

A new provisional date of 19/02/2013 has been given for the re-location of the Stapleford beat team to The Meeting Place, Nottingham Road, Stapleford.

### Crime review & Update

Figures from 1 October to 31 December 2012 and compared to same period in 2011.

**Burglary Dwelling** – On 3 of these offences in 2012 entry was gained via an external door which had been left unlocked whilst the occupants were elsewhere in the house.

**Autocrime** – 13 of these incidents where wheel trims had been stolen from vehicles in the Stapleford area. A male from Top Valley has been identified and arrested for all of these offences. In 4 of these offences entry was gained due to the vehicle being left unlocked overnight. Finally on 4 of these offences number plates were stolen from the vehicles involved.

**Robbery** – The increase in robbery offences is not personal robberies, this is local shops being targeted for cigarettes and post offices being targeted.

Chris Archer advised Operation “Darker Nights” continued again this year, during December to March, to reinforce good home security. They visit all victims of burglary from last year, plus five houses either side, to discuss home security and give advice. ## **Review of Neighbourhood Priorities**

### Vehicle Related Nuisance

Speed Enforcement Checks conducted in the following areas: Hickings Lane, Ilkeston Road Stapleford, Hillside Road Bramcote and Nottingham Road Stapleford.

PC Karl Barlow is running a traffic operation along the A52 relating to speeding, illegal use of mobile phones, non use of seat belts and inappropriate use of the bus lane.

### Fear of Crime namely Burglary

The local beat team are currently visiting all burglary victims of December 2011 – March 2012 and offering crime prevention advice to these residents. Many have been issued with shed alarms, timer switches and bells for handbags and purses. When visiting these addresses five houses both sides and five houses opposite the attacked address have also been visited and crime prevention advice has been given to these residents in an attempt to stop further crimes in the hot spot areas.

A number of Neighbourhood Alerts have been sent out to local residents advising them of recent crimes in the areas they live. This will continue as and when the Police have any information that we feel residents should be aware of.

A large amount of work has been completed in relation to getting Neighbourhood Watch contact details up to date, so that areas which do not currently have a

scheme can be identified in an attempt to increase the number of schemes and coverage in the local area. Anti Social Behaviour

The local beat officers are continuing to conduct Operation Animism and Pub visits on Tuesday and Friday evenings in the Stapleford area. This has incorporated a number of hot spot areas which have been highlighted not only through Neighbourhood Priority Surveys but also by the number of incidents reported to the Police. A large amount of partnership work is being done with the housing department and ASB officer at Broxtowe Borough Council to tackle ASB issues.

PCSO Chris Archer explained one youth had been charged with eight offences relating to "burglary other" (sheds, garages etc), contributing to the high number of offences above. The police are working with the Youth Offending Team in trying to rehabilitate the boy. They also liaise with Sharon Matthews, ASB Officer at Broxtowe council, where relevant.

**Identification and agreement of 3 Neighbourhood Priorities**

Between Monday 1<sup>st</sup> October 2012 and Monday 31<sup>st</sup> December 2012 a total number of 131 surveys were carried out in the Stapleford area.

Using the online survey data (this includes all surveys even those not completed online), the results of the Neighbourhood Priority Surveys which have been completed are as follows:
