Review of Neighbourhood Priorities

Vehicle Related Nuisance

Speed checks have been conducted by Special Constables in the following areas:

- Hickings Lane
- Ilkeston Road Stapleford
- Ilkeston Road Trowell

Fear of Crime namely Burglary

Stapleford beat team along with response teams have been providing regular patrols of areas of increased risk of burglary. Local residents have been spoken to and provided with crime prevention advice. Numerous neighbourhood alerts have been sent to members informing them of recent burglaries in their area. This will continue as and when the Police have any information that we feel residents should be aware of.

Theft of/from vehicles

Stapleford local beat have been providing crime prevention advice to residents in Stapleford, Bramcote and Trowell regarding vehicle crime. Stapleford beat team have been using a 'capture car' (Car which has CCTV throughout) in repeat locations for offences of theft from/of motor vehicle in the hope of catching offenders. There is no further update re this.

Another unmarked police vehicle has been used in the Stapleford and Bramcote area which is highly visible as it has anti vehicle theft advice printed on the car. This is to raise awareness to members of the public.

Additional information re recent police/council action

- Arrests relating to burglaries, have been made in Stapleford North. Offenders believed to be on remand, awaiting trial.
- Police operating patrol cars now have laptops so are able to deal with admin out in the community. Crime has reduced since there has been an increased presence of marked cars.
- There have been a number of bicycle thefts from Bramcote Leisure Centre. Since secure locks given out and increased patrols, this appears to have improved.
- There will soon be a new security camera installed at Montrose Court. The shops have purchased the camera and the council has arranged installation.

- Capture car recently used and was not broken into. It spent seven nights in different locations with satnav and mobile clearly on display..

- There has been a spate of vehicle crime in the Marshall /Stanley/Park Road area. Since warning signs have been placed, this appears to have ceased.
- Local councillors and Stapleford Community Group have been successful in achieving: a new pedestrian crossing to be installed next month on Toton Lane in Stapleford, near the Fairfield School, funded by money council has taken from local developers. Road markings will also be improved on several roads.
- Cow Lane Speed Limit – petition signed by over 100 local residents calling for 20mph speed limit to be imposed outside CofE school, presented by Stan Heptinstall, has been successful and will be implemented later this year.
- David Pearson extends an invitation to all to attend Stephen Lawrence Steering Group meetings (approx every six weeks) at William Lilley School. Next meeting 26 Feb at 4.30. CA noted date as police presence desired. Purpose of meetings for all partners of community to work against ALL forms of discrimination. - Helen Grindell reported problems with overflowing bottle bank at Hickings Park. There continues to be problems re ASB. Police now have new search light to be able to view groups in centre of park, away from static lighting and CCTV. PCSO Butterfield has spent much time trying to improve issues at the park.

Identification and agreement of Three Neighbourhood Priorities
