Cllr Heptinstall informed the meeting of the recent death of local resident Glyn Yeoman, a member of the community who had contributed to local life in particular through his involvement with Bramcote Primary School. Stan expressed his sadness and asked for Glyn to be remembered by those present - a moment's silence was observed.

5. Police update

KB provided the following crime data for the period 03.12.13 – 02.03.13:

10 x Dwelling House Burglary (DHB) – mostly forced entry to rear
1 x shed breaks
1 x robbery
9 x thefts

Some of the DHBs have targeted Asian gold. There have now been a number of arrests in connection with these. DHB is currently the top priority.

The theft incidents include - taking a vehicle without owners consent, moped stolen, pedal cycle taken from outside a pub, vehicle broken into as bikes left in vehicle overnight, 4 x theft of number plates.

KB had brought along a supply of free crime reduction measures which were made available to attendees, these included – tamper-proof number plate screws, vehicle crime packs, and 24 hour timers.

KB then updated the meeting as follows;

The local policing team now have access to a marked police vehicle and are also trialling an electric bicycle.

A capture car has been deployed in the area – this is left unlocked with items on display, CCTV is installed in the vehicle in order to help catch criminals in the act of committing theft.

Speed checks are being conducted tonight on Ilkeston Road by volunteer Special Police Officers.

KB now holds his Beat Surgeries at The Meeting Place, Stapleford – details can be found on the Notts Police website – www.nottinghamshire.police.uk alternatively residents are welcome to contact Karl direct and he will do a home visit.

6. Foxwood School

Chris Humphreys, Head Teacher, Foxwood School introduced himself and a colleague. CH gave a short presentation outlining a development project which is being undertaken by the school.

ACTION – Cllr IT to report to relevant organisation/department

Derby Road from Church Street to Bridle Road – strip of land badly littered

ACTION - Cllr IT to clarify ownership and responsibility for this piece of land.

Road into Bramcote Park/school site flooded – this due to 3 x drainage pipes in earth bank adjacent to cricket pitch being blocked, pipes appear to be clear on park side but not on the road side.

KB acknowledged that this an issue and advised that he had affixed advisory notices to vehicles parking in this manner recently and that he will be paying particular attention to the location
