

DON'T LET THEM BACK IN...

We've seen what they can do when given the chance.

The 2009-2013 Tories ran Nottinghamshire on a policy of cuts, closures and redundancies, and *STILL* left us with a deficit of £154 million.

In that time, the Tories:

- Slashed the Voluntary sector budget by 34%
- Sold off our 6 best care homes (all with good or outstanding care standards) at rock bottom prices – within 10 months all were failing care standards
- Wasted over £78,000 on a new logo, stickers and signs
- Employed an Improvement Consultant at £110,000 per year whilst making over 2700 hard-working staff redundant
- Closed the Connexions service a year early to deny young people vital career advice
- Withdrew the Dial-A-Ride service for the elderly
- Gave away £900,000 of taxpayer's money so that Trent Bridge could have a new scoreboard
- Increased transport charges to Day Centres by 75%
- Forced 60% of the elderly to pay more for residential care
- Abolished the Welfare Rights Service and savagely cut funding to the Citizens Advice Bureaux
- Closed Sherwood Industries – denying jobs to the disabled.

Only Labour can invest in and protect our public services – the Tories cannot be trusted with these vital services. And **any vote, other than Labour, will return a Tory County Council.**
